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About Shah Sachal Sami Foundation (SSSF)

Shah Sachal Sami Foundation (SSSF) is a non-profit organization, registered under the voluntary social welfare agencies ordinance 1961, working in the rural areas of District Nawabshah (Benazir bad) of Sindh, Pakistan. The organization aims to provide participatory development services to the most marginalized communities of the area who are backward in the overall development process. The main thrust is to empower the deprived peoples of rural areas by improving their socio-economic status, production capacities, and income generation sources and resources. In this regard, the formation of Peasant Worker Groups, (PWGs) Village Committees (VCs), and Cooperatives of Rural Communities are the core strategic aspects of the SSSF implementation process. The target groups are peasant women, landless and small farmers, and labor workers as they are 90% of the rural population and live at low standards of life. The target community is organized and motivated to initiate the development process through mobilization, skill development, and optimal utilization of the available resources. SSSF facilitates communities in the process of income generation through the provision of microcredit. Besides microcredit, SSSF also extends services in the areas of agriculture, food security, education, and primary health & hygiene.



Shah Sachal Sami was established in February 1989 in a small village of Union Council Chanesar, District Nawabshah. The organization was founded by educated youth in the village, who aimed to improve the living standards of the farmers through creation of awareness. SSSF was formally registered on 16th October 1994 under Societies Act 1861 as social welfare organization. Since inception, numbers of initiatives were carried out to strengthen small farmers to improve their socioeconomic condition. For a period of ten years, SSSF office bearers worked voluntarily and provided welfare services to the beneficiaries.

Strategic Focus Areas of SSSF and Impact of Interventions:

Key areas of focus for our organization



Women Empowerment

SSSF's work with women is rooted in intersectionality and rights-based approaches. Programs like JAZBA, Hum Qadam, and Naya Qadam have empowered over 10,000 women through legal aid, leadership training, voter registration, vocational skill-building, and GBV awareness.

From supporting widows and divorced women with vocational training (USAID project) to facilitating community action groups and legal support clinics, SSSF ensures that women are not only beneficiaries but also leaders of change. Our advocacy work has strengthened local institutions' capacity to prevent and respond to violence against women and girls.



Financial Inclusion

SSSF's microcredit initiatives are designed to enhance economic resilience, particularly among low-income households, women, and small-scale farmers. With support from PMIC and PPAF, over 10,000 individuals have accessed interest-free or subsidized microloans for livestock, agriculture, and small enterprises.

Our Microfinance and Business Revival Programs (like PRIME and BRP) have supported both individual borrowers and women-led groups, contributing to household incomes and local economies. Additionally, financial literacy sessions and recovery-focused models have ensured responsible borrowing and community accountability.



Education

Education is central to SSSF's vision of social progress. In partnership with Sindh Education Foundation and British Council, SSSF runs schools like

- Shah Sachal Sami Elementary
- Sachal Sarmast Primary
- Muntaha Middle School,
- Reaching over 1,200 students, primarily girls from underserved communities.

Through the ILMPOSSIBLE – Take a Child to School (TACS) initiative, over 6,000 out-of-school children were re-enrolled, supported by local volunteer groups. The DOSTI program further enhanced learning through sports in 10 schools across Nawabshah.

Strategic Focus Areas of SSSF and Impact of Interventions:

Key areas of focus for our organization



Health & Wash

Access to basic health and sanitation is central to human dignity. Under the ODF (Open Defecation Free) project funded by the Local Government Department of Sindh, SSSF mobilized 600 villages across Shaheed Benazirabad to eliminate open defecation through awareness campaigns, latrine construction, and behavioral change strategies. In response to the 2022 floods, SSSF conducted multiple medical camps and health support drives in collaboration with Shirkat Gah and Tzu Chi Foundation, reaching over 1,900 flood-affected individuals with healthcare, food packages, and hygiene kits. Our health response is guided by the principles of dignity, rapid mobilization, and local partnerships.



Climate Resilience

SSSF has consistently responded to climate-related shocks, especially floods, with immediate relief and long-term recovery support. Through partnerships with the World Bank (SIAPEP) and GRASP, we have supported farmers, livestock owners, and smallholder families in improving productivity and adopting climate-smart practices. By delivering training, providing solar energy solutions (PRIME Project), and improving access to clean irrigation systems, SSSF contributes to both environmental sustainability and local livelihood improvement. Additionally, we have provided financial and technical support to over 258 rural beneficiaries in agriculture and livestock enhancement programs.



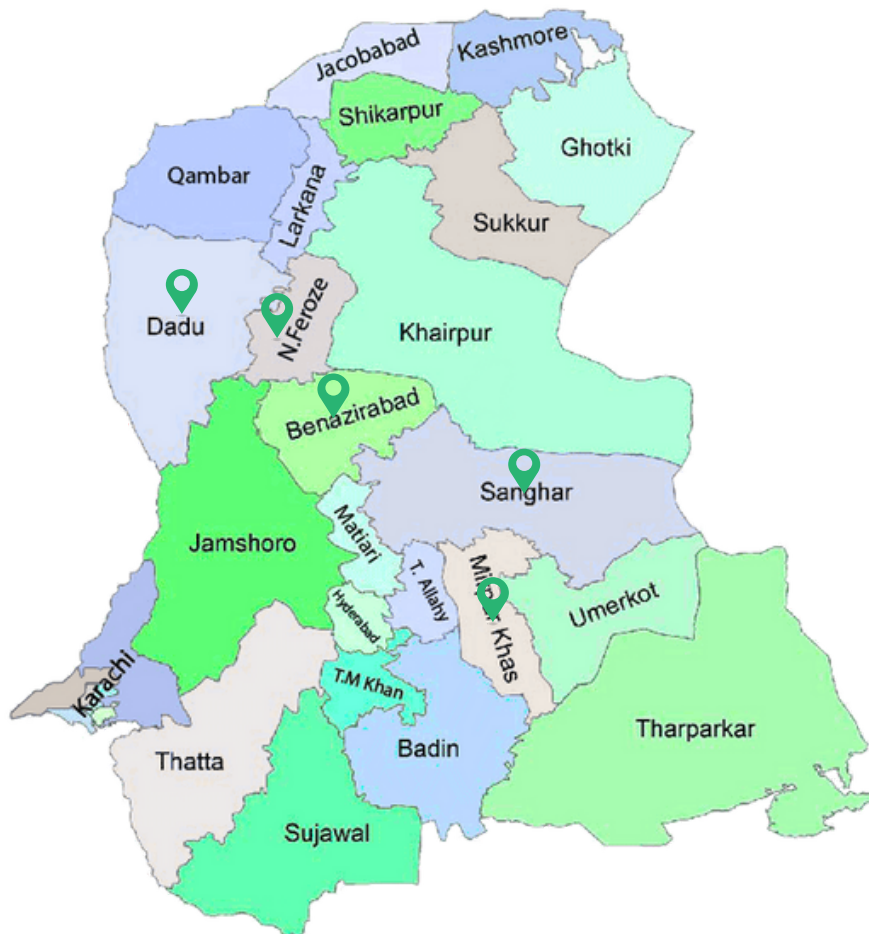
Skill Development

SSSF recognizes skills training as a powerful tool for poverty reduction and long-term empowerment. In partnership with BBSHRRDB, USAID, and other donors, we've implemented programs to train over 500 women and youth in high-demand fields such as sewing and tailoring, beautician services, early childhood education, IT, and bookkeeping. These trainings are not limited to classroom instruction. Participants receive starter toolkits, transport facilities, and post-training support to launch small businesses or secure employment. The focus is on marginalized groups—especially widows, divorced women, and unemployed youth—to ensure they have a fair chance at sustainable livelihoods.

Operating across:

Since its inception, the Shah Sachal Sami Foundation (SSSF) has implemented over 60 development projects across five key districts of Sindh—Shaheed Benazirabad, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Dadu, and Naushero Feroz. These initiatives span sectors such as education, health, WASH, livelihoods, microcredit, climate resilience, and women's empowerment. With a strong and consistent grassroots presence, SSSF continues to deliver inclusive, impactful, and community-driven development across some of the most underserved regions in the province.

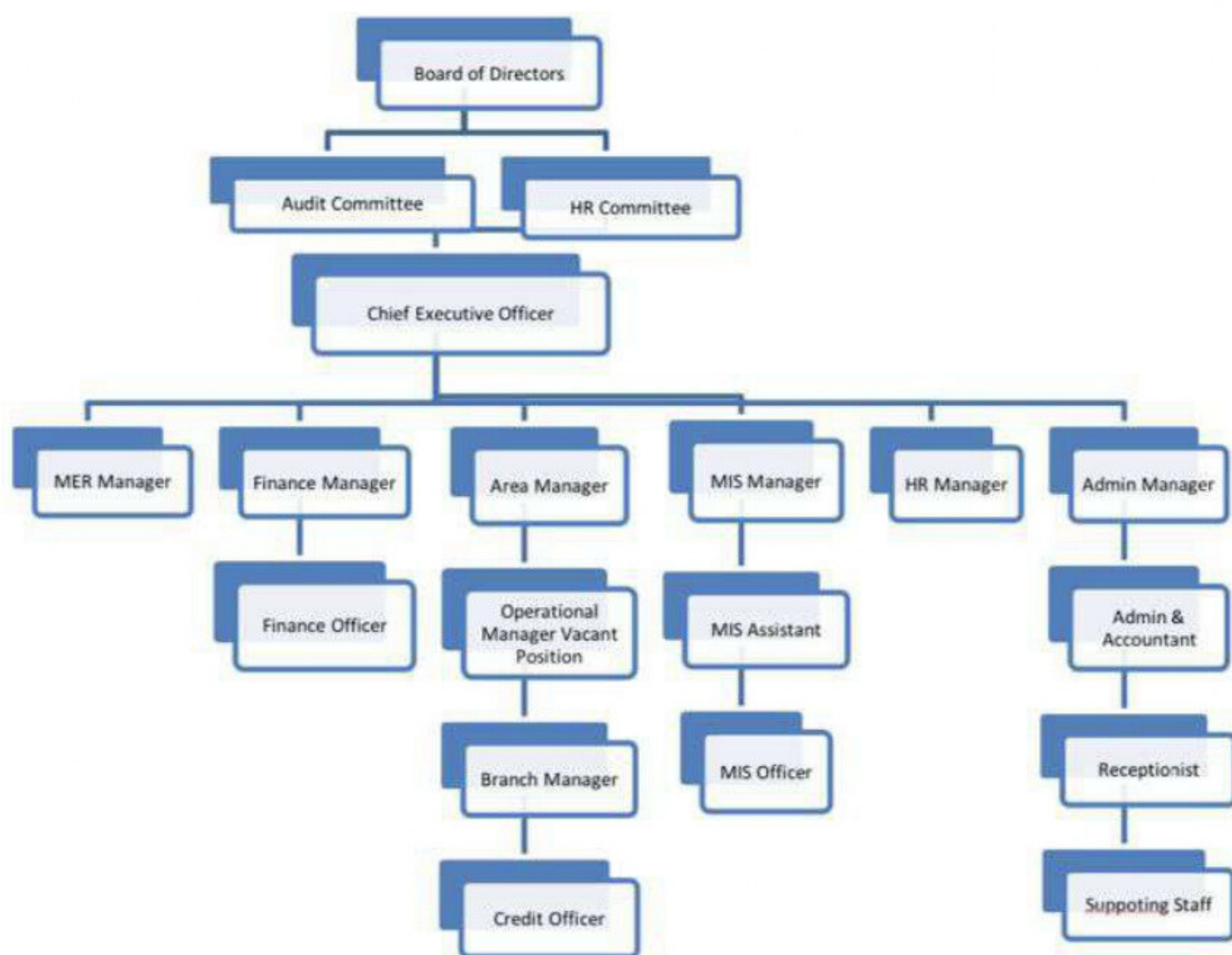
