

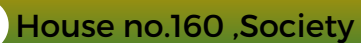

CAMPAIGN REPORT

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WOMENS DAY SEMINAR

Summary :

The seminar held at Muntaha Middle School on 8th March was a powerful advocacy event focusing on the rights of women in rural areas, especially those whose achievements often go unrecognized. The program featured representatives from NADRA (National Database and Registration Authority) and the Benazir Income Support Program.

The main objective of the seminar was to raise awareness among rural women about the importance of obtaining their national ID cards. Having a national ID card is not only a symbol of citizenship but also a gateway to accessing various government services and programs. One such crucial program is the Benazir Income Support Program, which provides economic assistance to underprivileged rural women and helps expand their household incomes. During the event, there was a camp set up to assist women in obtaining their national ID cards and it assisted over 500 women in this initiative. This initiative aimed to empower these women by giving them the recognition and rights they deserve as citizens. It also highlighted the role of women in rural areas in contributing to the economy and society, often without proper acknowledgment.

- 3. Access to Government Schemes:** CNIC cards enable women to access numerous government schemes and programs designed to support and uplift underprivileged communities, such as the Benazir Income Support Program and other social welfare initiatives.
- 4. Community Participation:** The event successfully attracted more than 35 rural communities from 4 different villages and 3 tehsils or districts. This large turnout indicates the effectiveness of the awareness campaign and the community's interest in accessing government services and programs.
